Official Language	Arabic
Business Language	English is the primary language of business and commerce. Arabic is used for government and legal documentation, while Hindi, Urdu, Malayalam, Tamil and other South Asian languages are commonly spoken in many workplaces and communities.
Currency	UAE Dirham (AED), commonly referred to as the Dirham (Dh or Dhs). The Dirham has been pegged to the US Dollar at USD 1 = AED 3.6725 since 1997, providing excellent currency stability.
Time Zone	Gulf Standard Time (GST), UTC +4. The UAE does not observe daylight saving time.
Weekend Days	Saturday and Sunday. The official working week is Monday to Friday. Most government organisations operate a four-and-a-half-day week, finishing around midday on Friday, while most private companies work a standard Monday to Friday schedule. Retail, hospitality, healthcare and logistics businesses often operate seven days a week.
Population	Approximately 11.5 million people (2026 estimate). Around 88–90% of the population are expatriates, making the UAE one of the most internationally diverse countries in the world. Indian nationals represent the largest expatriate community, with over 4 million residents.
Size of Country	Approximately 83,600 square kilometres , making it the third-largest country in the GCC after Saudi Arabia and Oman. It consists of seven Emirates: Abu Dhabi, Dubai, Sharjah, Ajman, Ras Al Khaimah, Fujairah and Umm Al Quwain.
Climate	The UAE has a hot desert climate with long, dry summers and mild winters. Summer temperatures typically range from 40–50°C , while winter temperatures average 15–28°C . Coastal cities experience higher humidity during the summer months. Rainfall is infrequent, averaging less than 100 mm per year , with most occurring between December and March.
